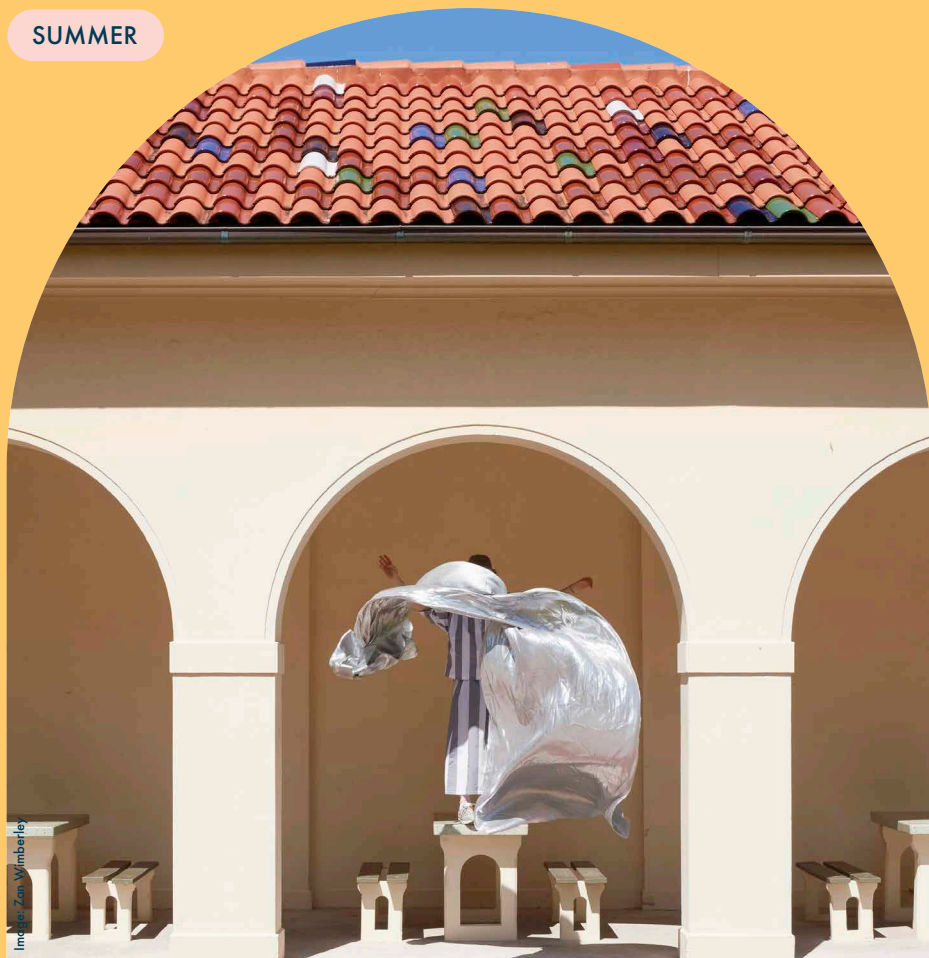

The program culminates with a concert performance in Bondi Pavilion Theatre, followed by a professional recording of each band's original debut track.

Each month we host free Lunchtime Concerts in the High Tide Room and over 50s can join our popular weekly Sunshine Singers choir. Our signature youth programs, the Bondi WAVE and Beach Bash concert, make sure our music community continues to thrive at Bondi.

Our annual music program concludes the year with our ever-popular Carols by the Sea in the Dolphin Court. Join us to celebrate the festive season at this free community event on Wednesday 9 December 2026.

Film Screenings

We bring the best in live theatre to you in these year-round film screenings. This series captures the West End's hottest stage shows, including the very popular National Theatre Live productions, starring some of the biggest names to tread the boards. Mark & Evette Moran Nib Literary Award



25TH ANNIVERSARY

Rub shoulders with prize-winning authors and local bibliophiles as we announce the 2026 recipient of the \$40,000 Nib Literary Award and toast a quarter century of rewarding remarkable research-based storytelling!

Initiated by the Waverley Library community in 2002, the Nib has become one of Australia's most prestigious literary prizes. It is presented annually by Waverley Council with support from principal sponsors Mark and Evette Moran, and community partner Gertrude & Alice Bookshop. Nominations open in April, with prizes awarded in November.

Opportunities

Local Creative Collaborations

Our Local Creative Collaborations program supports Waverley's creative community to connect and create. Opportunities are available for artists at all stages of their practice – from emerging to established.



BONDI PAVILION YALAGANG ROOM

This opportunity is open to creatives across all artforms, with a priority given to development of new artistic works. This residency is a funded opportunity, with a financial contribution of up to \$5000 to support artists' fees and direct project costs. Up to five, two-week artist residencies will be offered in 2026.

BONDI PAVILION ARTIST STUDIO

The Artist Studio is for local creatives at all stages of their practice. Successful applicants may access the dedicated studio space at Bondi Pavilion up to six weeks to immerse themselves in their practice.

BONDI PAVILION MUSIC STUDIO

This opportunity is for local musicians who are interested in creating, developing or rehearsing new music at Bondi Pavilion. A limited number of two-week residencies will be available in 2026.

Waverley Artist Studios:

Waverley Artist Studios are for emerging, mid-career and professional artists interested in working within Bondi and the greater Eastern Suburbs area. Studios are offered in year-long residencies at the Bondi School of Arts.



The Henry Lawson Writers Centre Residency Program

Launching in July 2026, this new residency offers local writers a quiet, dedicated space in the historic residence at Waverley Cemetery. Up to six residencies will be offered annually. EOIs open early 2026.

Accessible Amenities

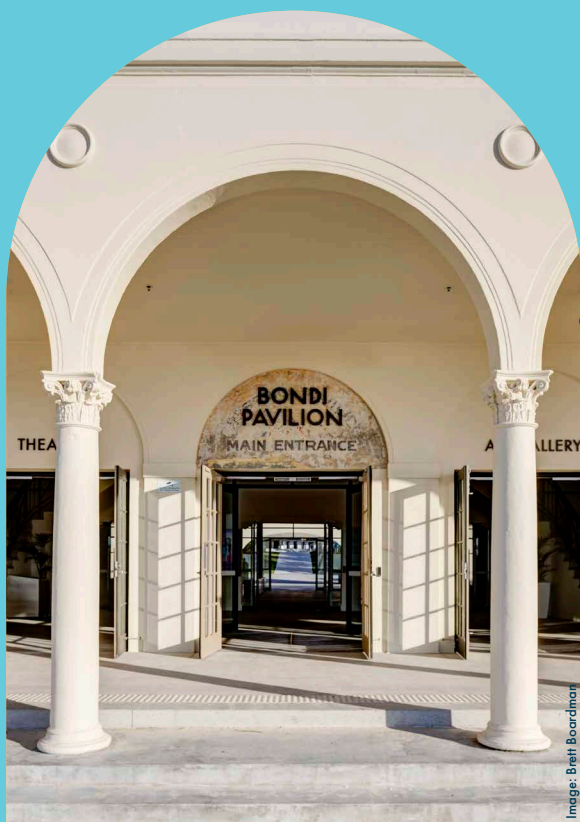
